Lieutenant General Pettus assumed his present duties as Military Deputy Commander, U.S. Southern Command, Doral, FL, on November 7, 2024. U.S. Southern Command deters aggression, defeats threats, rapidly responds to crises, and builds regional capacity, working with our allies, partner nations, and U.S. government (USG) team members to enhance security and defend the U.S. homeland and our national interests.

As a general officer, he served as the Commandant of the Air Command and Staff College, the Commander of the 378th Air Expeditionary Wing, and the Vice Commander of the United States Air Force Warfare Center. His staff assignments include duty as the Chief of the Commander's Action Group, U.S. Air Forces Europe, and the Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff, Operations, U.S. Forces Korea.

In his previous assignment, General Pettus served as the Commander, 12th Air Force (Air Forces Southern), Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona, the Air Force component to U.S. Southern Command.
