MEMORANDUM FOR All Subordinate Commands and Tenant Units

SUBJECT: Renewal of Declaration of a Public Health Emergency on U.S. Army Garrison Miami

- 1. Following Federal, State and County declarations of a public health emergency (PHE), and in consultation with my Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO) and Command Surgeon, I am renewing my declaration of a public health emergency on this installation IAW DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03. This declaration will terminate automatically 90 days from the date of this memorandum unless it is renewed again and re-reported, or sooner terminated by the undersigned, or a senior commander in the chain of command.
- 2. As the Senior Commander for USAG Miami we are renewing the implementation of the DoD Health Protection Condition (HPCON) Charlie level framework to provide specific guidance to installation personnel during this PHE. Attachment depicts HPCON measures and impacts to installation services.
- 3. The PHEO and staff are hereby directed to continue recommending measures to the undersigned to identify, confirm, control, and abate this PHE using the guidance outlined in DoDI 6200.03. The PHEO and staff will provide advice and guidance on measures that may directly impact the health, safety, and movement of installation personnel and property.
- 4. The PHEO will identify these measures and share information with local, state and federal public health and public safety officials to ensure our efforts are suitable and synchronized. Shared information may include personally identifiable health information, but only to the extent necessary to protect the public health and safety.
- 5. Personnel are expected to obey and otherwise abide by all public health and welfare directives (procedures, protocols, provisions, a/o orders) issued pursuant to this PHE. Personnel in violation of public health and welfare directives issued pursuant to this PHE may be subject to punishment under 42 U.S.C. §271, the UCMJ, or subject to adverse civilian personnel action IAW 5 U.S.C. Chapter 75.
